Marzano's Classroom Instruction that Works

Days 1 and 2 are scheduled either before school or in early fall; Days 3 and 4 (both half-days) occur in late fall and then early spring. This program is fully sustainable after year one, as mentors will be trained to serve as program presenters and leads the following year (fee-based offering provided by oklaMET cadre trainers who are current classroom teachers).
