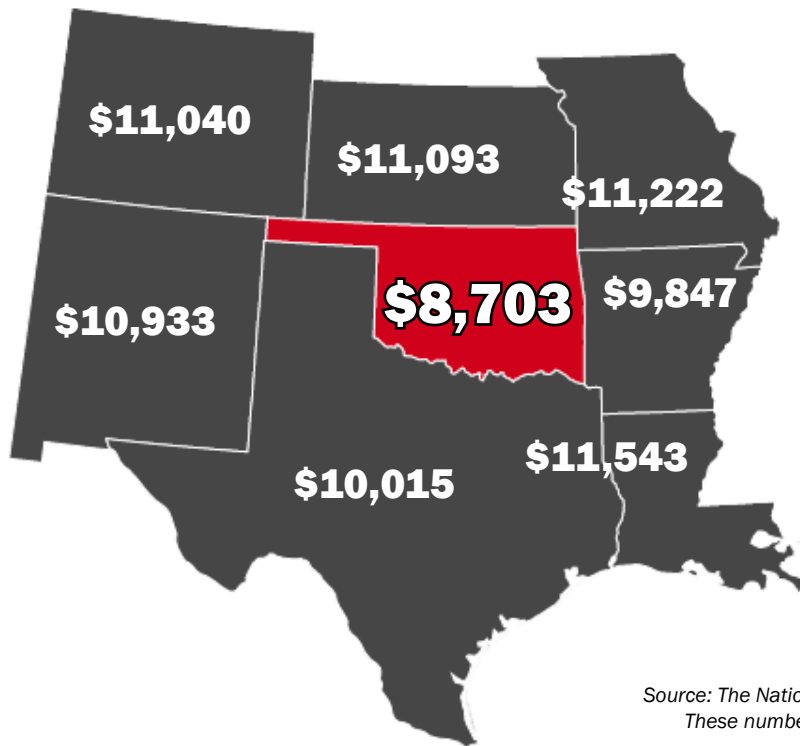


Expenditures Per Student
