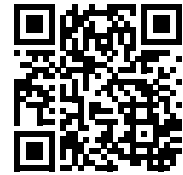

OEA members across the state join forces to advocate for public education: more resources for our students, better working conditions, and policy that strengthens our schools.

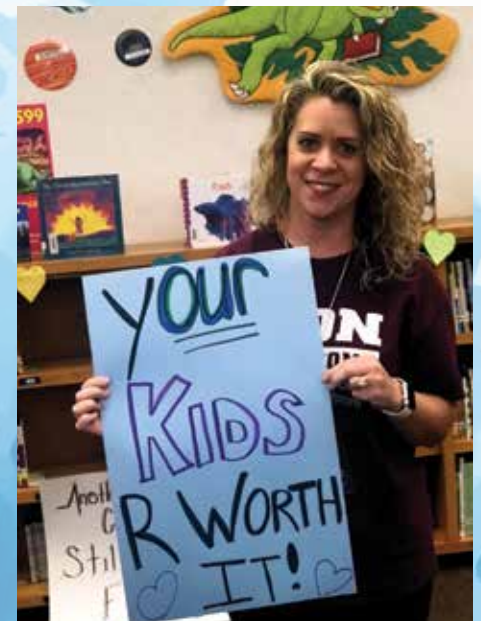

Teachers consistently say that they pay for needed classroom supplies out of their own pockets, because they want to make sure their students have the resources they need to excel. Horace Mann, an approved OEA vendor, is a longstanding national sponsor of DonorsChoose, a non-profit organization that connects teachers in need of classroom resources with donors who want to help. Horace Mann representatives can help bring you a four-step solution, and it starts with registering with DonorsChoose.

1. Start a DonorsChoose account.
2. List a fundraising project with a reasonable goal. (DonorsChoose says projects costing \$400 or less are more likely to be completely funded.)
3. Use Facebook and Twitter to promote your project.
4. Email your students' parents. They can donate as little as \$1 toward your project, and whatever they give will help them feel that much more invested in their children's success.

Making Waves Since 1889

What started as 11 teachers meeting in Guthrie has turned into tens of thousands of public school advocates across Oklahoma. From state aid to retirement to salary to health insurance, OEA has led the way in public education for more than 130 years.

1919: OEA members successfully lobby for the first **state aid bill for schools**.

1942: OEA members help gather enough signatures to put the issue of **state teacher retirement benefits** on the ballot. Oklahoma voters approve the constitutional measure.

1987: OEA secures **due process for education support professionals** after fighting a court battle that lead all the way to the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals.

1990: OEA members stage a four-day statewide walkout that ended with the emergency enactment of **House Bill 1017**. More than 20,000 attend. The education reform bill raised teacher pay, cut class sizes, funded professional development, and injected hundreds of millions into public education funding.

1935: OEA members successfully lobby for the first **state minimum salary schedule**.

1965: The Midwest City Classroom Teachers Association becomes the first **bargaining** local in the state. Five years later, the Oklahoma Legislature votes to allow teachers to bargain with local schools boards, after an intense campaign by OEA.

1988: OEA-backed legislation requires all schools to offer **group health insurance** to employees.

2018: After a year of grass-roots organizing, OEA members stage a **nine-day statewide walkout** that lead to tens of millions in additional classroom funding and pay raises for teachers and support. More than 50,000 attend on the largest day. It was the most successful walkout of the national **#RedForEd** movement.
